Do numbers mean anything? What about these numbers?

216, 46, 11, 7, 6, 4180, 1143, 5

They tell us a story

These tell us something of the story of our work during the first 4 months of this year. **216** individual

incarcerated men and women, were reached by **46** faithful men and women serving on the **11** teams of volunteers, who go with the Gospel into **7** Connecticut prisons, with the support and encouragement of **6** chaplains.

Numbers, of course can never tell the whole story of what God is doing in the lives of men and women.

Each of these **216** incarcerated men and women have their own personal stories to tell. Their stories are often of poverty, abuse, neglect, drug and alcohol addiction; and of course the crimes that have landed them in prison, sometimes repeatedly. Crimes committed out of rebellious self-will, greed, fear and often out of desperation.

Their stories all have recurring themes of personal despair, rejection, guilt and longing; a longing for a life with meaning and purpose.

Only Jesus

The goal of the Free Inside team members is to share with them the great news that what they are longing and looking for **can only be found in Jesus Christ**. Only He can free them from sin.

A few recent inmate comments.

“Alpha is the best program in the prison.” (we hear this repeatedly)
“It helped me see that I am a sinner and need God” **JD**

Another said: *“Through Alpha I am leaning to walk with God, not away from Him. I see God at work in my life, through the good messages about the Lord”* **CJ**

“Through Alpha I am constantly changing to walk better with the Lord. This program is helping me so much.”

You have had an important role in what God is doing.

- ▶ *Through your prayers*, for inmates and for all, who like ourselves, endeavor to bring the love of Christ to them.
- ▶ *Through your encouragement*. Do you know someone who ministers in prison? Ask them how it is going. Ask them how you can pray for them.

Retreat days on the Person and work of the Holy Spirit

These days are great opportunities for God to bring what may still only be an intellectual grasp of the Gospel deeper into the hearts and experience of those in our programs. So far we have held 3 of these days and will be having 2 more.

We arrive early on Saturday or Sunday morning, to set up the room in time to receive the participants.

After explaining the purpose of the day, we start the first of 3 teaching videos. If the chaplain has been able

to arrange a meal to be brought to us, we break for lunch.

Eating together makes for a great time of relaxed fellowship and an opportunity to learn more about what is on the hearts of those to whom we minister. Our willingness to eat what they eat means a lot, it deepens the trust they have in us. This simple act is a practical way for us to show something of Christ's love for them.

At the end of the third session there is an opportunity for one on one prayer ministry. Many testify that it is often during these prayer times that God does a significant work in their lives.

More numbers

4180

Since the New Year, I travelled **4180** miles for the ministry an average of 1045 miles per month.

In these days of high gas prices 4180 also represents a large proportion of our ministry budget. I cannot cut back on travel, so I would ask for prayer for God's provision. Perhaps some who read this will consider giving toward this need.

Is the total number of Bibles and Christian books distributed so far this year. Other than the Bible the most requested book is "*The Purpose Driven Life*". We have given out Bibles and books in English, Spanish, and a few in Portuguese, Chinese, Korean, Vietnamese and Khmer. Inmates have plenty of time to read. One inmate recently said that he had never read a book in his life until prison.

- **Pray for the Holy Spirit** to open their hearts to Jesus Christ through reading the Bible, and other Christian books. Ask Him to bring them to a living faith in Jesus.

Without the Holy Spirit, Alpha is just Alpha. Pray that our ministry will always know the power and presence of the Holy Spirit.

Included in this joy is the fact that several of the inmates accepted the reality of Jesus into their lives for the first time during the Holy Spirit weekend, and the power of the Holy Spirit's loving embrace was obvious to all those attending.

When David Horton decided to go to a Cincinnati Reds ball game with his girlfriend, he knew he was a wanted man. He had failed to appear in court for a drug charge.

During the game, the wanted man decided to give his girlfriend a smooch, and that kiss was displayed on the "*Kiss Cam*." Everyone at the Great American Ball Park saw the kiss, including his parole officer, who was at the same, May 7, 2003, game.

Before the night was out, the parole officer and a policeman arrested Horton, 24, in his front-row seat.

"*Out of all the coincidences, we had 20- or 30-thousand people at the ballpark, and who do they put on the 'Kiss Cam'? And then, who is there but his parole officer?*" said Richard Goldberg, Horton's attorney. (Source: Associated Press (5-30-03), through CNEWS.)
